About BME

The direct predecessor of the Budapest University of Technology and Economics (BME) is the Institutum Geometrico-Hydrotechnicum, founded in 1782, which was the first institute in Europe to train engineers in university structure.

BME's mission, inseparable from training and education, is to conduct scientific research which encompasses the three activities required to make up the innovation chain: fundamental and applied research, technological product and service development, and the application of research findings.

The popularity of BME's foreign language courses has been growing year by year. Students from abroad now represent over 12% of BME's enrolment, hailing from more than 30 countries.

Many young people are studying at BME as part of the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship programme, which aims to support the internationalisation of Hungarian higher education. With this large number of international students, BME ranks second in Hungary.

With its consistently high rankings, BME is among the top universities globally, ranked in the top 2-6%. The British ranking organisation Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) evaluates the performance of over 1,400 higher education institutions across five broad areas: arts and humanities, engineering and technology, life sciences and medicine, natural sciences, and social sciences, covering a total of 51 disciplines. Budapest University of Technology and Economics (BME) is the only Hungarian university to feature in the engineering and technology category, consistently achieving higher rankings year after year.



Public transportation

Budapest's transportation is simple, fast, and safe! Whether you want to travel by public transport, car, bike, or scooter, the city offers every option for you. Learn everything about public transport, getting to the city centre, cycling, accessible travel, and parking! Find the most convenient mode of transportation for you and get anywhere easily in the capital!



Information about taxi services

There are a number of taxi companies and independent taxi firms operating in Budapest. Please only get into a qualified, licensed taxi. We recommend that you order a taxi using an app or by phone. Budapest taxis have standardised signage: the cars are yellow with the words "qualified Budapest taxi/minősített budapesti taxi" on the left-side front door, the number plates are yellow, and the dashboard and the two rear doors display a table of fixed official taxi fares.







Useful Information

Payment

The currency in Hungary is Hungarian Forint. Almost all establishments accept payment by card, but very few places, for example, markets, accept only cash.

Sockets

In Hungary we use two types of power plugs/sockets - type C and type F.

Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and type F has two round pins with two earth clips on the side.

Hungary operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.

Emergencies

If you need help or assistance, feel free to contact your visit coordinator from BME. In any emergency situation you should call the toll free number 112, as this is the contact number for the emergency services in Hungary.

Weather

Please, make sure to check the weather forecast before coming to Budapest, in order to prepare for the trip accordingly.

The average temperature in Budapest:

Winter (December-February): +4°C - -2°C

Spring (March–May): +17°C – +7°C

Summer (June-August): +27°C - +16°C

Autumn (September-November): +16°C - +8°

Smoking restrictions

Smoking is prohibited within 10 m from the entrances of institutions of national and local government, as well as at the public transport stops.
