## PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The “Eastern Partnerships” programme supports German universities in strengthening their partnerships with universities in the countries of East-Central Central, South-East and Eastern Europe, the Southern Caucasus and Central Asia. By promoting exchange relationships including all academic levels, it enables long-term and broad-based cooperation in teaching and research between the participating universities and thus supports their internationalisation efforts. The Eastern Partnerships help to sustainably enhance international relations through education and research.

## Funding is provided for

- Mobility of students, doctoral students, researchers, professors, assistants and senior university staff to a foreign partner university for study, research and teaching purposes (including internships)
- Stays at the German partner university for study, research and teaching purposes (including internships)
  - for students and doctoral candidates (up to six months)
  - for postdoctoral researchers, experienced researchers, professors, university staff (up to three months)

**East-Central, South-East and Eastern Europe, South Caucasus and Central Asia** (Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Georgia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan)
